Why Paul is important to the Story of the Bible

Paul wrote some of it

Paul explains the relationship between the parts of the Bible.

Read the Old Testament for inspiration and motivation but not application.

Take your application cues from Jesus new covenant command.

A new command I am giving you, as I have loved you, you are to love one another. And by that unique kind of love, the entire world will know that you are my follower. -- Jesus, shortly before His crucifixion

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Jesus Christ who took on the form of a servant, who never powered up, even though he was God in a body.

Be kind and compassionate to one another and forgive each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

You are not your own. You've been bought with a price so therefore, here's what you should do. Honor God with your bodies.

Paul authenticated, in a way nobody else could the reason we have the Bible. And that's the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

The Apostle Paul was a real person.

Year 55 AD Paul writes 1 Corinthians

Year 52 AD Paul had started a church in Corinth

Year 49 AD Paul had visited Jerusalem and Jesus' Apostles

Year 40 AD Paul had visited Jerusalem and Jesus' Apostles

Year 37 AD Paul is converted to Christianity

Now brothers and sisters I want to remind you of the good news that I preached to you three years ago when I was physically with you. For what I received, I passed on to you. As of first importance that Christ died for our sins according to the Scripture and that he was buried. And that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures and that he appeared to Cephas.

And then he appeared to the twelve.

And he appeared to more than 500 of the brothers and sisters.

Most of the people who've seen Jesus alive are still living, though some have fallen asleep.
